What is the Federal Poverty Level?


The Federal Poverty Guidelines

are used to determine who is eligible for various public programs and benefits like SNAP and Medicaid. The guidelines consider only pre-tax income, and adjust annually for inflation.

1 in 4 families in poverty are married households.




1 in 3 families in poverty are single-mother households.





Poverty and Race


Most Oklahomans living in poverty are white, even though white Oklahomans have a lower overall poverty rate compared to other groups.
